surface of the print is not affected in the least with the press. Whether it be a letterpress or colletype picture, or a photograph by any process, the mounted picture retains exactly the same surface as before mounting. The dry-mounting process therefore eliminates all the difficulties attendant on the use of paste or other wet adhesive. Even when the prints are mounted on the thinnest paper there is no warping or cockling. The process also commends itself on its economic side, for it can be worked at a very high speed, and there is no loss through spoiled prints. This method of mounting must appeal to the modern printer and stationer, for it can be used in many directions in the printing and kindred trades. The mounting of half-tones and three-colour prints on papers with a rough surface which is now coming into such favour; the mounting of illustrations on calendars, etc.; are uses to which it might be placed with great advantage, in fact, there is hardly any limit to its utility.

List of Water-Marks.

ATER-MARKS are to paper what Trade Marks are to other manufactured articles, namely, a sign denoting the manufacture. They are impressed in machine-made paper by means of a fine light-wire cylinder with a wire-woven pattern. This is so arranged that the impression is made on the paper the moment it ceases to be pulp.

Although a systematic classification of water-marks has never yet been accomplished, they have served in the past in tracing the history of the paper trade of different countries, and as a means whereby to fix the periods of undated documents. As a case in point, we might mention that when Mr. Garrett was in Newfoundland, he was able to correct the supposed date of an old document in the Museum at St. John's by five years. Water-Marks were first used in the rag papers

During the 15th century more elaborate designs are to be found, but the practice of using the maker's name as a water-mark did not come into vogue until the 16th century. Even in these early days the variety was most extensive, and from some of them e.g. armorial bearings, national, personal, and other cognizances, proof may be obtained of the extent and wide dissemination of the paper trade in the 14th and 15th centuries.

O N April 6th, the Lord Mayor and Sheriffs attended the sixth Annual Dinner, held at the Gaiety Restaurant, of the Institute of Printers and Kindred Trades of the British Empire. The headquarters of the Association are at St. Bride's Institute, with which it is affiliated.

During the past few days our Mr. Garratt has been paying a hurried visit to Paris, where he found business considerably dislocated through the Printers' strike, which commenced on March 19th.

The gross value of the estate of the Rev. E. C. Hawkins, Vicar of St. Bride's, whose lamented death was announced in our March issue, is returned at £4,947.

What is believed to be the oldest paper book in existence is in the possession of the Corporation of King's Lynn. The first entry is a transcript of a will dated 1809, whilst the latest entry is dated 15 Richard II. It is called the "Red Book of Lynn" on account of its original binding being of that colour. Age had reduced the leaves to an almost fibrous substance, but fifty years ago it was repaired, the leaves being carefully resized.

The question of machine repairs is always an important Machine item with any manufacturing business, and especially is Repairs. this the case in the printing trade, where the wear and tear is considerable. Whilst this may be said to be an axiom, it is surprising to find how few printers there are, who really know what it cost to run their machines, including additions and repairs thereto. In drawing attention to this important matter, the Progressive Printer truly states, that the first price of a machine, including its installation into the plant in running order, is no more the real cost of the machine, than the amount paid for the rent of the bare walls is the cost of the factory. The additional expenses on any machine that has been running for a few years, if itemised, would astonish the majority of master printers. It is therefore advisable to keep count of these expenses, so that when the time comes to replace a machine, easy reference can be made, as to which type has proved the cheapest. Undoubtedly the best way to accomplish this, is to keep the repair charges etc. on the card index system, in which case a card is kept for each machine. Its cost and date of purchase is entered thereon, together with the cost, as it is incurred, of each repair and added improvement. The system also enables the man who desires to get the best results out of the men and machines under his charge, to detect those machines that seem to have more than their share of repairs. In this way careless and incompetent workmen can be traced, when they should be early candidates for other jobs. It is such leakages that must be avoided in these days of stronuous competition; they do not seem much in themselves, but in the aggregate they amount to a fair sum in the course of a year, especially in a factory where a large number of workpeople are employed. A hint is usually all that is required for the employer of labour to remedy, what might be found to be a considerable loss.

WHAT OTHERS TO ARE DOING

A N old-established customer on the South Coast mentioned to one of our representatives the other day the interesting fact that his firm has done a local auctioneer's printing for no less than 111 years. This is undoubtedly a creditable record, especially when we state that the account is still open.

The exports of British Writings, Printings and Envelopes for the first three months of the year amounted to £322,155, as compared with £306,331, of the same period of the previous year. The exports of paper, previously imported, from January to March, amounted to £38,099, as compared with £22,267 of 1905. The imports of unprinted papers for the corresponding periods amount to £1,019,920, as compared with £856,169 of 1905.

There is probably no Colony in which there is a steadier demand for printers than Canada. Out of a population of almost a quarter of a million at Toronto, it is estimated that over 3,000 workpeople are employed in the printing and allied trades. Drawing attention to the modern plant equipments possessed by the Canadian printers, Mr. C. Brunning, in a recent issue of The Canton Magazine, stated that proofs of small jobs are taken from the stone with proof planers covered with felt, thus saving time in taking galley proofs. Not only so, but the compositor can judge the effect of his work before submitting a proof to the reader. The Canadian compositor is paid from \$12 to \$20 per week of 58 hours.

The Atlantic Daily News is the title of a ten-page newspaper, printed in English and German, and published on board the Hamburg-American S.S. "Amerika." Information is of course received by wireless telegraphy. Another novel newspaper is the Engaged Couples' Advertiser, which is rapidly gaining in popularity in Switzerland. The only news is the announcement of engagements, for which the proprietors pay at the rate of ten-pence for every address they receive. Agents are appointed who attend all the churches to hear the announcement of banns. The venture has cost £16,000 to launch.
