

FROM the 239th Quarterly Report (to September 30th) of the London Society of Compositors, we learn that the total funds were £62,358, as compared with £63,402 for the corresponding period of last year, thus showing a decline of £1,044. The Capital Accounts stands at £45,309, as against £46,577 in 1906. Whilst this is so, the membership roll appears to be steadily increasing. The total number of members at the time of the last report was 12,290, against 11,512 twelve months ago, or an increase of 778.

We regret to have to announce the death of Mr. F. A. Dimbleby, J.P., which occurred last month at his residence at Richmond, Surrey. Deceased was the proprietor of the *Richmond & Twickenham Times*, and other papers, and took a keen interest in all local affairs.

A London daily paper states that since the beginning of the present year three hundred newspaper issues have been confiscated in Russia, and nearly four hundred editors and contributors have been prosecuted. On the other hand, M. Gunther, Minister of Justice, has issued an order throughout Austria by which the practice of examining newspapers by the police, before their delivery by post, will be abolished. The system previously in vogue was thought to be incompatible with the liberty of the Press. We should have imagined that very little thought would be necessary to come to this decision.

The London Trades Council, at its last meeting, passed the following resolution:—"This Council regrets that the Treasury, in appointing a Committee to inquire into the desirability of the Government executing the whole or part of its printing without the intervention of contractors, has omitted to nominate any person connected with practical printing, and calls for the appointment of such person or persons either from the Labour group in the House of Commons, or from the ranks of Labour outside, believing that the absence of practical knowledge on the Committee will minimise the value of the inquiry."

A case recently came before the Courts wherein the plaintiff, a printer, estimated for a certain job for \$\infty 90, and secured the order. When they received the copy, it was alleged to have been so indecipherable that they had to send a compositor to the defendants to make some of the MSS, out. Consequently they demanded £35 7s. 6d, for the corrections, and this amount the defendants refused to pay. The Judge gave a considered judgment in favour of the defendants, with costs. It transpired in the hearing of the case, that the plaintiffs had not included the question of corrections in their estimate. This was surely an oversight, but the above case proves that it is a question which might lead to considerable expense, if attention is not called thereto on all estimates.

The Committee of the Caxton Convalescent Home has issued an appeal for support. It appears that over 1,300 members of the printing industry have enjoyed its benefits, and in the majority of cases have returned to their employment in renewed health and strength. In order to make the necessary extensions, a debt of £1,700 has been contracted, and this amount the Committee are anxions to raise with the least possible delay. It might be pointed out that the Institution has no endowment, and not being recognised by the public, it does not participate in the Hospital Saturday or Sunday Funds. Subscriptions may be sent to Mr. E. J. Carr. 33 Chancery Lane, W.C.

At the sixty-eighth Anniversary Festival of the Newsyendors' Benevolent and Provident Institution, which was presided over by Sir William Treloar, £1,650 was subscribed for the Institution. Amongst those present were Miss Marie Corelli, Sir Chas, Dilke, Sir Horace and Lady Marshall, Mr. J. Lewis Coward, K.C., Mr. E. Dicey and others well-known in the printing and allied industries.

It is announced that Mr. Upton Sinclair, the author of that now well-known book, The Jungle, is about to publish a novel exposing the manities of the American millionaire. To secure "copy," it is alleged that he became butler to Mrs. Vanderbilt, without, of course, revealing his identity.



PRACTICAL NOTES

Modern Printing Papers. (Continued.) The quality and constitution of paper has of necessity been varied to meet these conditions, and also to satisfy the often unreasonable demand for something "cheaper."

Possibly the skill of the paper-maker in manufacturing a "novelty" which looks like paper, feels like paper, and sells like paper may account for some of the stuff that goes to make a book. He relies, perhaps, on the publisher's taste.

It must not be forgotten that the consumer can get as good a sheet of paper to-day as his grandfather did, if he pays the proper price, but it is absurd to ask a paper-maker to sell a high-class article at a low-class price. If the consumer knew something of the conditions of manufacture he would quickly realise this, and thus the technology of paper is obviously a matter of considerable interest. The quality and value of most commercial articles is judged by other means than mere appearance and feel. Not so, paper.

A brief description of the process for converting rags into paper may serve as an introduction to a study of some of the technical difficulties connected with the use of it. The rags are carefully sorted into various grades, cut up into small pieces by hand or machinery, and boiled for some four or five hours in a closed vessel in a weak solution of caustic soda. They are then washed, partially broken up in suitable machines, and bleached. After bleaching the rags are "beaten" or thoroughly disintegrated into small fibres, the process of beating, as will be shown presently, exercising an important influence on the nature of the paper finally produced. The finely beaten "pulp" is coloured to the required extent, and made into paper on the paper machine, though for high-class paper the pulp is made into sheets by hand,

The pulp runs on to a horizontal endless wire cloth, and the large quantity of water mixed with it escapes through the meshes of the wire, leaving a thin wet sheet of paper on the upper surface of the wire. This sheet is passed through rolls which serve to take out more of the water and compress the fibres. The paper is dried by steam-heated cylinders, and finally glazed or polished by means of

calenders. Good papers are sized with gelatine, being passed through a vessel containing a solution of gelatine, commoner qualities being also sized with rosin size, which latter material is always added to the pulp during the process of beating.

The nature of the finished paper is determined by several factors, the chief of these being that known as "beating." The fibres are, in this process, submitted to the action of long knives, some of which are fixed in a narrow box, and the remainder on a revolving cylinder. The distance between the two sets of knives can be altered at will, and the knives may be sharp or blunt. The condition of the beaten pulp can be modified to an extraordinary extent, by varying either the sharpness of the knives, the rate at which the distance between the knives are altered, or the time occupied in beating.

If the fibrous material is beaten quickly with sharp knives, a pulp is obtained from which the water drains away readily, yielding a comparatively soft spongy paper. If, on the other hand, the beating is effected with blunt knives, and occupies a long time, the pulp acquires the power of retaining a certain proportion of the water, and the paper is harder, semi-transparent, and exceedingly tough.

The strength, bulk, and surface of paper are all influenced very materially not only by beating, but by the pressure of the couch rolls and the calenders of the paper machine.

The durability of the finished paper depends upon its freedom from traces of chemical impurities, and the care exercised in treating the fibrous material so as to reduce it to a condition of pure cellulose, a term applied to the ultimate product isolated from cotton, linen, and other vegetable fibres by suitable chemical treatment. The addition of excessive quantities of clay and other mineral substances also lowers the quality. Small traces of acid, bleach residues, or chemicals used in the manufacture produce rapid deterioration, but these substances are soldom found in paper, as their action is now well understood.

Cotton and linen fibres produce the best paper, because in the raw state they exist as almost pure cellulose, and require but little chemical treatment for conversion into paper, and also because the ultimate fibre is long, and consequently allows of a greater variation of beating effect. In proportion as the fibrous material employed deviates from the condition of pure cellulose, so the paper suffers. For this reason the use of any mechanical wood pulp in paper is to be deprecated, since such material contains resinous and non-fibrous constituents which set up rapid decay.

The outery about the deterioration of paper has only arisen of recent years since the introduction of other fibrous materials.


