In a recent case heard at Birmingham, the Judge said that if only tradesmen would take the precaution to have orders confirmed in writing by principals, they would escape many risks which, in course of business, arose from contact with unworthy persons.

# RACTICAL NOTES

Under-bidding and

THERE is a wide difference between the above terms in the getting of business engaged in the Price-Cutting, printing and allied trades. There is such a thing as one printer, for instance, underbidding another

where both are expert as to the cost of producing the job, and where one of these can come in under the other by reason, perhaps, of a little shrewder knowledge in some of the details of his business, or by reason of superior facilities. This advantage is legitimate, and on this fact the honest competition in the printing business is based. But, says The Progressive Printer, price-cutting is an entirely different thing, which partakes of many exigencies in the business.

There is the ever-recurring condition of a percentage of printers under a pressing need of work whose living requirements are in the small figures. Men of this stamp may know the cost of a job, but little urgencies in their offices, and the modest income needed, will tempt them to descend below the mark of fair competition and tocut the price under the profit to get the job. This is foolish, but men who practice it sometimes offer explanations which hold them above the charge of wilful slashing of prices.

But the price-slashing nuisance in the printing business has been built up by a different class of men-the ignoramuses who do not know what constitutes the factors entering into the cost of printing.

With the great number of printers the one sure remedy for the price-cutting evil would be to get organized. There must be concerted action amongst printers if they are to be held together at the point where figures submitted cannot be lowered and the profit sustained, and the customer compelled to pay the price. There are but two things that can be done. The first is reasonable and effective-it is education; and yet this matter will never comprehend all the wrong-doers, who are increasing possibly as fast as the old ones are being cured. But it is a means nevertheless. The other is practically complete organization of employing printers, getting the great majority within the fold, and then the minority offenders can be hung up high and dry. There is a great work going on in this direction, and it remains to be seen how broadly successful it can be made.

# WHAT OTHERS TO ARE DOING

For the last six months of the year, the directors of the Financial Times recommend a dividend on the ordinary shares, at the rate of 12 per cent. per annum, making 10 per cent. for the year. The directors of Messrs. Perry & Co., Ltd., the well-known Birmingham pen makers, have declared a dividend on the ordinary shares at the rate of 15 per cent. per annum and a bonus of 1/- per share, which makes a distribution amounting to 20 per cent. per annum. The report of Country Life, Ltd, for the past year shows a gross profit of £20,372 2s. 1d. About £2,500 has been placed to reserve and a dividend at the rate of 10 per cent. per annum has been declared in addition to a bonus of 2½ per cent. on the ordinary shares. £6,533 17s. 9d. was carried forward.

The Caxton Magazine draws attention to a proposed new invention which appears in a recent issue of an American journal. While we do not think there is any immediate danger of the present methods of producing newspapers and other printed matter being discontinued, still the idea set forth is unique and not altogether impossible. An inventor is perfecting a machine with which he expects to revolutionise not only the newspaper business, but which is to become the common means of communication. The machine, which is being designed, he intends for producing newspapers under his method. It consists of a phonograph into which the editor speaks his editorial, his news item, or an advertisement as the case may be. The sound waves are engraved automatically on a cylinder, very much the same as with the present phonograph. From this cylinder is produced a hard metal cylinder by a magnetoelectro process. This hard metal cylinder is placed on a machine which very much resembles the present newspaper printing press, but in place of printing characters on the surface of the paper with ink, it will make small indentations in the paper.
