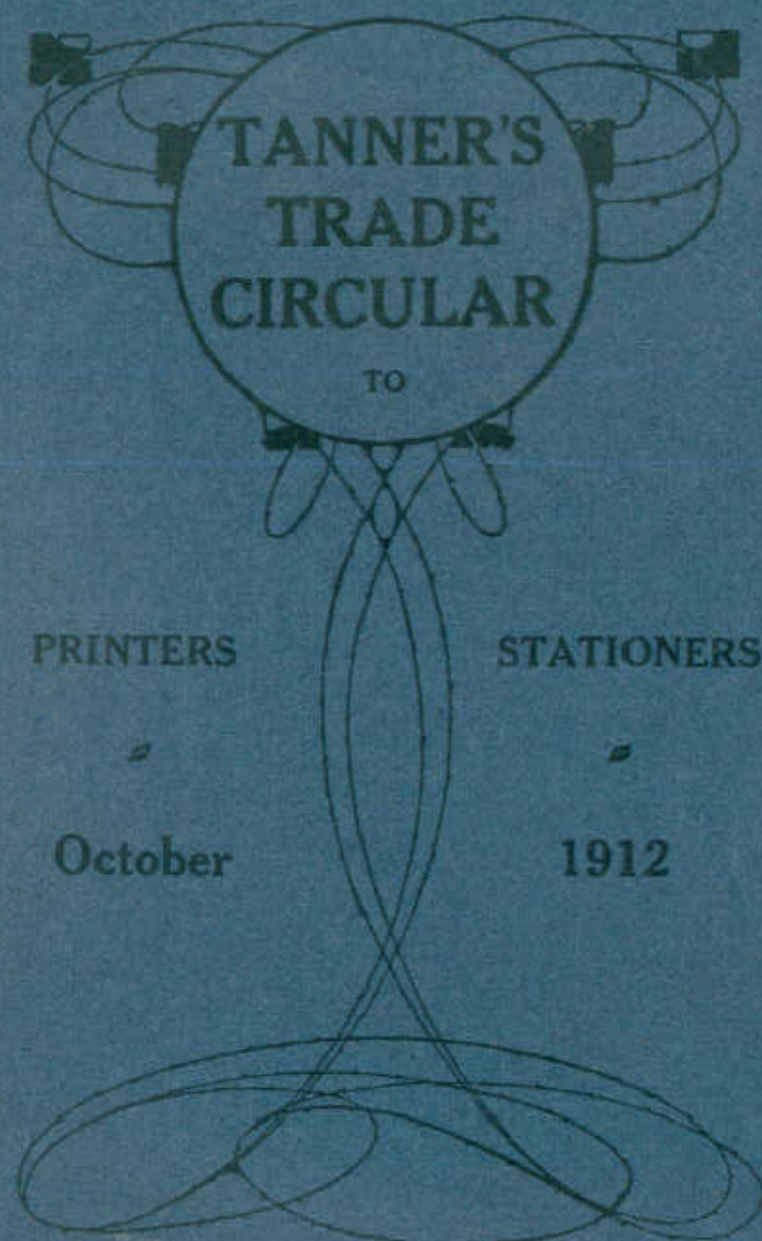

A TREASURY minute states that for the future the Crown copyright will be reserved in official books, literary or quasi-literary works, issued by the Government, and charts and ordnance maps. In the case of official papers, e.g., reports of Select Committees, Acts of Parliament and reports issued for the use of the public, no steps will be taken to enforce the copyright of the Crown.

To secure the automatic registration of copyright under the new Act, the following words should appear on all new publications: "Copyright under Act of 1911." This naturally takes the place of the old phrase: "Entered at Stationers' Hall."

Mr. Robert Donald has been appointed president of the Institute of Journalists for the ensuing year. At the last conference it was suggested that the value of a university training should be considered as one of the qualifications for membership of the Institute.

Mr. Joseph Cooke, a former proprietor of the *Sheffield Independent* and chief proprietor of the *Boston Guardian* and *Doncaster Gazette*, left estate of the gross value of £36,340, of which the net personalty has been sworn at £34,614. The will of Mr. J. Dawson, of W. Dawson and Sons, stationers, Cannon Street, E.C., shows an estate valued at £59,379 gross, with net personalty of £36,750; that of Mr. B. H. Mander, of Mander Bros., Wolverhampton, at £155,373; that of Mr. E. P. Barlow, a director of Wiggins, Teape and Co., Ltd., at £134,033, with net personalty of £104,371; that of Mr. Andrew Lang, the author and journalist, at £12,498 gross, and that of Mr. F. L. Sangorski, of the firm of Sangorski and Sutcliffe, bookbinders, Southampton Row, W.C., at £376 gross, with net personalty of £219.

crown, wire stitched, and pasted in stout tinted covers. The linotype cost at 6d. per 1,000 (a very low estimate) would be 1s. 2d. per page, and the paper, etc., cost 5d. per page. The firm in question quoted 1s. 2d. per page, so that for 3d. per page (about 25s.) they are making up 96 pages, setting titles, etc., machining, folding, wire-stitching, and pasting on covers. Under such conditions it cannot be expected but that wholesale stationers and ink manufacturers at times receive some nasty financial knocks.

Following their usual custom the Institute of Printers are preparing their souvenir for 1912-13. As is well known, copies are presented to members and to all gentlemen attending the annual dinner held in March, and the Committee appointed to carry out the work are anxious that the next issue should surpass all previous records. Rapid progress is being made with the new Government Stationery Office in Stamford Street. The building covers about 80,000 square feet and is being constructed of ferro-concrete at an estimated cost of about £125,000.

During July the Labour Exchanges received 2,102 applications for employment in the printing and allied trades. The number of vacant posts notified was 767, and 531 posts were filled through the Exchanges.

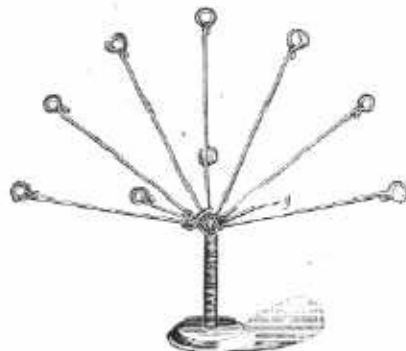

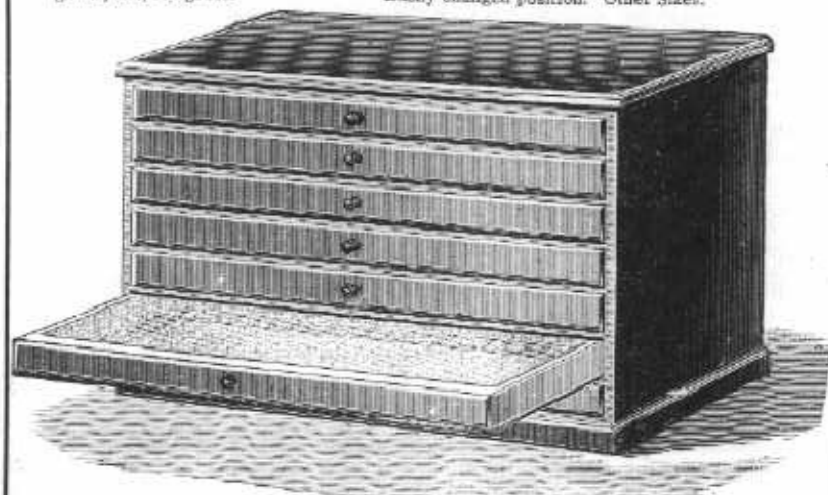

PRACTICAL NOTES

The Art Man's Opportunity.

The last few years have brought about a revolution in printing styles. The public of to-day know how to appreciate the work of the typographical artist. In large and progressive business houses nothing but the best in the way of print is tolerated, with the result that the demand for men of real ability and good taste daily increases. The day of the typographical blacksmith is over, and in his place the man of artistic perception and refined taste is required.

Printing houses, particularly those engaged in the production of the cheaper classes of work, find that their customers are asking for a better article, and the problem arises of how to better the standard of their work with the same staff. The manager and his assistants are already fully occupied with the administrative duties of the office. What is to be done to ensure a uniformly higher standard of work? How can the taste and effects of the typographical artist be obtained from the ordinary case-hand?

Here is the opportunity of the artistic compositor who has studied his trade, who can use his pencil. He can solve the problem. Progressive houses have recognised this, with the result that many of them now employ the typographical designer—a man whose sole duty is to improve the standard of work and to ensure that standard being maintained.

This man must have peculiar qualifications to ensure his success. He must first and foremost be a thoroughly practical man—a man who has worked at the case and has turned out good work there; a man who knows and appreciates the difficulties and troubles of the compositor by practical experience. He must be able to take copy, and indicate in a few strokes of his pencil how the job is to be set; the type, rule and ornament to be employed, so that the job can be set by even a young apprentice and yet be of a first-class order, as if set by the thoroughly expert and artistic craftsman.

WHAT OTHERS ARE DOING

ACCORDING to the *Printers' Register*, Messrs. E. S. and A. Robinson, Ltd., wholesale stationers and printers, of Bristol, whose employees number close upon two thousand, have inaugurated a profit-sharing scheme. Mr. Edward Robinson, in explaining the matter to their workpeople, said the firm had experienced a period of expansion and prosperity during recent years, and as a thank-offering it had been decided to set apart a third of all profit above a fixed minimum, which will be communicated to the accountants. For the last three years this minimum has been passed by a good amount, and if the scheme had been in operation during this period the average distribution would have been £2,500. This would work out at equivalent to something like two weeks' wages to each individual. All whose wages are £3 per week, and under will participate; others earning above that limit are for the most part already paid by some bonus or profit or else directly on the results of their own efforts.

The U.S.A. Government Printing Office at Washington is engaged on a series of reports which, it is said, will constitute a record in such class of printing. The Immigration Report will run to 56 volumes of from 600 to 1,200 pages each; the Monetary Report comprises 24 volumes; the Child Labour Report 19 volumes; and the Fisheries Report 12 volumes.

It is said that the success of the Harmsworth and the Albert Reid paper companies in Newfoundland has stimulated the interests of American capitalists in the Colony. The American Newfoundland Pulp and Lumber Company has been incorporated in the State of Michigan with a capital of £160,000.

The current issue of the *American Printer* gives a few practical notes on the "Possibilities of the Circular Background," which will appeal to printers. Such backgrounds for advertising matter are effective and economical, especially when the colour scheme is carefully selected. The idea, no doubt, comes from nature, and is similar to the effect produced by an object or person posed on the horizon.

Books written by women (and published by a woman) are set up and printed at the works.

Il Risorgimento Grafico, Milan, has opened an international competition, free to all, for a design for a modern book. The competition is dedicated to the memory of G. B. Bodoni, and many valuable prizes are offered, the first prize being 200 lire offered by the Municipality of the city of Saluzzo, and grand gold medal, offered by the municipality of the city of Milan. Designs have to be submitted for fly leaf, title page, dedication page, first page of text, and page of text with notes. Full liberty is permitted with regard to the headings adopted, and two colours can be used. Designs must reach Milan by midnight of March 31st next, but full particulars may be obtained from the offices of the Review, Via Tadino 51, Milan.

The report of the Aberdeen University Press, for the year ended June 30th last, states that the profit, after allowing for depreciation, amounts to £4,562, which, with the balance brought forward, makes £5,631. The directors recommended a dividend at the rate of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. per annum on the ordinary shares, whilst £1,500 was written off the book value of the company's machinery and plant, and a balance of £1,606 carried forward.
