

334 letters were issued during the past quarter by the Printers' Medical Aid and Sanatoria Association, bringing the total issue up to 2.752.



Mrs. Cox was at the same time presented with a silver bowl.

Black and White which was about to have celebrated its majority has been absorbed by The Sphere, and will, therefore, be controlled in future by Mr. Clement K. Shorter.









For the 3,261 lots offered at the sale of the second part of the famous Hoe Library, £94,323 was realised. For about the same number of lots in the first part of the sale, the amount realised was £199,472. The prices obtained were generally much higher than the prices paid for the books. For instance a Gutenberg Bible of 1450-55 was purchased for £3,500 and sold for £5,500. The only remarkable falling off in price was with "Canterbury Tales," printed by Caxton in 1477-8. The price paid for this book in 1896 was £1,320, but at the sale it only fetched £1,000.

Saturday, March 16th is the date fixed for the next pension election of the Printers' Pension Corporation. It will be held at the Finsbury Town Hall. There will be 89 candidates, and each candidate will receive either a pension or a grant. The Longest Unsuccessful Candidates Committee is appealing for votes for three deserving third-application candidates.

Tenders are wanted by the Borough of Bermondsev for the supply of stationery for one year from March 31st next. Full particulars may be obtained from the Town Hall, Spa Road, S.E.

In a recent action in the King's Bench Division, before Mr. Justice Scrutton, the abbreviation "Ltd.," was held to be permissible for the word "Limited."

The Association of Correctors of the Press has removed to 83 Farringdon Street, E.C., immediately opposite the Memorial Hall.

A Bill to amend the Australian Cypyright Law has been introduced which will give protection to British artistic work, and, further, our American cousins will have to print and publish their books in Australia simultaneously with printing in America to secure copyright protection.

The will of Mr. W. P. Metchim, Clapham Common, S.W., printer and stationer, shows an estate valued at £48,218 gross, with net personalty of £23,360; that of Mr. R. Duxbury, of Yates, Duxbury & Sons, Ltd., paper makers, shows an estate of the gross value of £85,360, and net personalty of £84,254; that of Mr. J. Howard, Sibton Park, Hythe, late proprietor of the Chartham Mills, Canterbury, paper manufacturer, is valued at £65,636 gross, whilst the net personalty has been sworn at £28.857; and that of Mr. T. Adams, of the firm of Adams Bros. & Shardlow, Moor Lane, E.C., printers and lithographers, at £23,116.

Bronzing.

MR. J. W. ROBERTSON continues his very interesting and practical article on this subject in *The* Sales and Wants Advertiser, from which we have

made the following excerpts.

"In the first place, art paper gives as much, if not more, trouble than any other paper. When bronzing on art papers, have you ever found that although the colour has taken perfectly on the paper, you cannot induce the bronze to do the same with the colour? The result of your efforts is a patchy affair, with bronze on some parts and no bronze on others. The cause of this is that the preparation is of such a nature that part of the ingredients are absorbed by the coating of the paper directly it is printed. You can prove this for yourself by bronzing directly after printing, and finding you still get a patchy result. The remedy is to reduce the colour with something that will have no tendency to disunite with any other ingredient of the preparation.

"I would strongly advise those who meet this trouble to have their preparation especially made to suit the particular paper they use. Failing this, the finest thing that can be done is to take equal proportions of stout varnish, dissolved gum arabic, and best copal varnish, and mix a little at a time with the preparation until you find your trouble ceases. This remedy does not reduce the consistency of the preparation in any way.

"On other art papers you will find that the bronze takes perfectly and holds well while wet; but as soon as it is thoroughly dry you can rub most of the bronze off again. The cause in this case is exactly the same as in the last—the difference being that its action is slower owing chiefly to the preparation having a higher viscosity. The remedy is the same as before.

"B right enamel and flint papers are alike regarding these properties for bronzing. The only trouble that you are likely to meet in the case of these papers is that of rubbing off when dry. The cause is just the opposite to that in the case of trouble with art papers, i.e., that the preparation will not hold sufficiently to the surface of the paper, the surface being so hard. A little dissolved gum arabic alone is the finest remedy for this.

WHAT OTHERS TO ARE DOING

THE distribution of handbills in the streets of Paris has been barred, the reason being that they give an untidy appearance to the footpaths when indiscriminately thrown away. To prevent the nuisance, the Council sought powers to tax handbills, but the Chamber of Deputies would not assent to this course being taken.

At the forthcoming printing exhibition, which is to be opened in Manchester on April 17th, there are to be a number of competitions. For typographic and lithographic printing there are fourteen sections, and a gold, silver, and bronze medal will be awarded in each. Ten guineas will be awarded in prizes for the best essays. The subject of the competition, which is open to managers, overseers and foremen, is, "If starting a business, how would you spend £1,000 at the Northern Counties Exhibition?" For workmen only, the subject is, "What did you see at the Printing Exhibition which you think might be introduced in your department with advantage?"

The last annual report of the Sunderland branch of the Typographical Association shows that the amount of unemployed benefit paid during the year was the lowest for the past ten years.

At the annual dinner of the directors of the Co-operative Printing Society, Ltd., it was announced that there were 1,430 distribution societies throughout the Kingdom. The trade done last year amounted to £70,358,000, and the profit on the year's operations was £10,847,000. In addition to the above amount, the Wholesale Societies trade last year amounted to £36,275,125, while the profit was £1,106,915. Altogether there are 119,752 persons employed in the movement.

The membership of the Newspaper Press Fund was increased last year by 140, making the total roll 2,249. The grants and

pensions distributed amounted to £5,139, the largest in the history of the Fund.

The operative printers of Edinburgh recently made demands which included, an advance of 1d. per hour, a 50 hours' week instead of 51, alteration of overtime rate, and recognition of only two classes of labour at the trade—journeymen and apprentices. The employers recommended an advance of ½d. per hour, an increase of overtime rates between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m., reorganization of boundaries, recognition of only two classes of labour at the trade, and "walking time" when going from one job to another. It is satisfactory to be able to report that these suggestions were accepted by the men.

During last year 10,914 books were published in the United Kingdom. This is an increase of about 100 on the previous highest figure.

The New York Sun has changed hands for two-and-a-half million dollars. It has been acquired by Mr. W. C. Reich, of the New York Times and other publications.

Mr. W. Heinemann, the well-known publisher, says, in the Publishers' Circular, that "British copyright has, up to the passing of this new Act, existed throughout the British Empire, and publication in any part has secured protection in every part of it. From this day forward the British Copyright Act protects books nowhere but in Great Britain, Ireland, and the Crown Colonies. All our great possessions overseas pass out of British copyright law, and are enabled to make their own conditions upon which they will or will not protect British books. These conditions may be made onerous, even intolerable, for we are at the mercy of Colonial

democracies, who are more likely to be swayed by local considerations than by their interest in literature or the rights of British authors and publishers."

Messrs. Raphael Tuck & Son, Ltd., have paid an interim dividend upon the ordinary shares, at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, for the six months ended October 31st last. The report for the Argus Printing Co., Ltd., for ten months trading, shows a profit of £11,268, with the balance brought forward from last year of £4,328. The directors recommended a dividend at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum, and transferred £3,000 to reserve account, while £5,022 was carried forward.

We note that the directors of the Mergenthaler Linotype Company have declared the regular quarterly of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. for the three months ended 30th December, together with an extra dividend of $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. A year ago the extra dividend declared was 5 per cent., but the present announcement does not indicate a decline in the total distribution of the Company, because with each of the three previous quarterly dividends of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. paid in 1911 an extra distribution of $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent was made, whereas in 1910 the first three quarterly dividends were paid without any additional dividend, the whole of the extra being paid with the December dividend.

A machine which may have important effects on the paper making trade says the Sales and Wants Advertiser was recently described by its inventor, Mr. W. J. Gee, at a meeting of the Royal Society of Arts. From time immemorial the recovery of sediments has been done almost entirely by means of simple subsidence in settling tanks, but now Mr. Gee has proved that with his machine he can obtain all the deposit in practically as many minutes as it formerly took days. The invention is a centrifugal machine which not only separates the deposit at a great speed, but accurately grades it into any desired number of degrees of fineness. The number of materials to which it is applicable is almost endless, and instances were given of its use in recovering the paper pulp waste from the effluent of paper works, and the preparation of Tripoli, pumice, emery, and other polishing and grinding powders. It is claimed that in the case of china-clay the cost of production may be reduced by 40 per cent.
